The report of the local inquiry committee was considered by the Academic Council and the Executive Council at their meetings held on 2nd December, 1986 and 11th January, 1988, respectively.

The resolution of the Academic Council and the report of the Executive Council are as follows :-

Resolution of the Academic Council

It was resolved that it be reported to the Executive Council that, in the opinion of the Council, the college of Arts and Commerce started by the Roman Catholic Church of Our Lady of Grace Trust at Papdy, Vasai, District

Thane, and named as St. Gonsalo Garcia College of Arts and Commerce, be granted affiliation for the teaching of the courses of study for the First Year B.A. and First Year B.Com. examinations in the subjects mentioned below for a period of one year with effect from 20th June, 1984, subject to the fulfilment of the following condition to the satisfaction of the Executive Council :-

(The subjects and the condition are the same as those mentioned in the above Senate resolution.)

Further that it be recommended to the Executive Council that the college be permitted to have one division of the F.Y. B.A. class and also one division of the F.Y. B.Com. class and that any additional division, if required, be opened with the prior approval of the University.

Report of the Executive Council

The Executive Council, after considering the report of the local inquiry committee, the resolution of the Academic Council thereon and the report of compliance of the conditions mentioned in the Academic Council resolution received from the Managing Trustees, Roman Catholic Church of Our Lady of Grace Trust, Papdy, Vasai, District Thane, report to the Senate that it is of the opinion that the college of Arts and Commerce started by the Roman Catholic Church of Our Lady of Grace Trust, by name St. Gonsalo Garcia College of Arts and Commerce, Papdy, Vasai, District Thane, be affiliated to the University for the teaching of the courses of study for the First Year B.A. and First Year B.Com. examinations in the following subjects for a period of one year with effect from 20th June, 1984, subject to the fulfilment of the following condition to the satisfaction of the Executive Council :—

(The subjects and the condition are the same as those mentioned in the above Senate resolution.)

At their meeting held on 22nd February, 1988, the Senate considered the above application together with report of the local inquiry committee, the resolution of the Academic Council thereon and the report of the Executive Council in the matter.

Dr. S. D. Karnik moved, as recommended by the Executive Council, and Principal R. G. Sohoni seconded—

"That the Senate approve of the report of the Executive Council in the matter of affiliation of a College of Arts and Commerce started by the Roman Catholic Church of Our Lady of Grace Trust at Papdy, Vasai, District Thane, and record their opinion that the St. Gonsalo Garcia College of Arts and Commerce, Papdy, Vasai, District Thane, be affiliated to the University for the teaching of the courses of study for the First Year B.A. and First Year B.Com. examinations in the following subjects for a period of one year with effect from 20th June, 1984 :—

F.Y. B.A. Examination

- Compulsory English ;
- Marathi or Hindi ;
- Foundation Course—Paper I ;
- One of the following groups—
 - (a) Economics, History, Marathi
 - (b) Psychology, Sociology, English/Economics.

F.Y. B.Com. Examination

- Foundation Course—Paper I ;
- Business Communication ;
- Business Economics—Paper I ;
- Commercial Geography ;
- Mathematical and Statistical Techniques ;
- Accounting and Financial Management ;

subject to the fulfilment of the following condition to the satisfaction of the Executive Council :—

That the college authorities have given an undertaking in writing :—

1. that they will intimate to the University the position regarding acquisition of land for the college building as also of the plans of the building giving details of accommodation proposed to be provided for the various purposes ;



2. that they will appoint (a) duly qualified teaching staff including the Principal and report their appointments to the University for approval, (b) the requisite non-teaching staff in the appropriate scales of pay and (c) that they will ensure that the quota reserved for backward classes for posts in teaching and non-teaching categories is filled up and that they would submit the report to that effect to the University;
3. (a) that they will appoint a qualified librarian in the prescribed scale of pay;
(b) that they will incur an expenditure of Rs. 15,000/- on the purchase of books and journals for the college library during 1984-85;
4. that they will create a reserve fund as advised in the report of the committee;
5. that they will appoint a local managing committee as required by Section 43(3)(b) of the Bombay University Act, 1974, and will hold at least two meetings of this committee, one in each academic term and will maintain a proper record of these meetings."

Shri P. B. Acharya moved the following amendments and *Shri S. A. Modak* seconded—

Add the following conditions Nos. 6 and 7 after condition No. 5:—

"6. that they will provide proper facilities like Canteen, Common Room for Boys and Girls, Gymkhana facilities etc."

"7. that they will hold Students' Council election in time."

The Vice-Chancellor stated that she had to rule out of order both the amendments moved by *Shri Acharya*. In ruling out the first amendment out of order, she stated that condition No. 6 could not be accepted because it ended with the word "etc." which was a vague term. Whenever a condition was to be laid down, it should be very specific. With regard to the second amendment, the Vice-Chancellor stated that it could not be accepted because the Students' Council elections were not held at the college level. Students' Council elections were held by the University and therefore this condition could not be laid down.

The Pro-Vice-Chancellor then read out the compliance report received from the college in the matter of fulfilment of the conditions.

Discussion on the motion then ensued in which *Shri Vinay Sahasrabuddhe*, *Shri N. N. Naik*, *Shri Vijay Vaidya*, Professor *Gopal Dukhande* and *Shri P. B. Acharya* participated.

The Vice-Chancellor then requested *Dr. S. D. Karnik* to reply to the points raised in the course of the discussion.




Dr. Karnik stated that the report was prepared immediately after visiting the college on 10th September, 1984. However, there was some discrepancy pointed out by the office with regard to the correct and proper name of the Trust which managed this college. They went on changing the name of the Trust. There was a technical flaw and, therefore, the report could not be placed before the Academic Council, Executive Council, Senate earlier. He stated that he was not defending the delay on the part of the committee. It was a very ticklish problem and still the problem had not been solved fully.

Referring to the point raised by a member regarding the eligibility of students to appear for University examinations and award of degrees, Dr. Karnik stated that the House must be aware that in the past also students appeared for examinations and their results were declared. Subsequently they got their degrees also while the process of making local inquiry was going on. Sometimes the House also referred back to the Executive Council for its reconsideration which also caused delay. He stated that there had been a number of colleges which started with Junior College in whatever space that was available to them and later on they acquired land and constructed building of their own. He pointed out that the members of the House should remember that they were considering the first report because of technical flaw and subsequent report would throw more light on this aspect.

Referring to the point raised by Shri P. B. Acharya whether the committee had verified that the appointment of Ag. Principal had been approved by the University, he stated that the next Local Inquiry Committee would inquire whether the approval had been received by the University or not.

The Pro-Vice-Chancellor added that as far as Librarian in the College was concerned a qualified librarian had been appointed as per the compliance report received from the college. He stated that this was different kind of compliance report. Normally the conditions proposed to be laid down by the Academic Council were communicated to the colleges only after the reports were approved by the Senate. However, if the matter was pending with the Senate as an item, the office used to write letters to the Principals of Colleges informing them the conditions which were proposed to be laid down and requesting them to send compliance reports in respect of fulfilment of the conditions, which include the progress made till the date on which the letter was sent by the colleges to the University. This was the kind of compliance reports the University was receiving.

The original motion was then put to vote and *carried*.

**REPORT OF THE LOCAL INQUIRY COMMITTEE FOR
ROMAN CATHOLIC CHURCH OF OUR LADY OF GRACE
TRUST'S ST. GONSALO GARCIA COLLEGE OF ARTS
AND COMMERCE, PAPADI, VASAI, DIST-THANE.**

I. General Details

1. *Names of the members of the local inquiry committee :*
 - (1) Dr. S. D. Karnik,
 - (2) Prin. S. D. Mulgaonkar,
 - (3) Prin. P. M. Potdar and
 - (4) Prof. B. D. Ghonasgi.
2. *Member who visited the college :* Excepting Principal Potdar, who was out of India, all other members visited the college.
3. *Date of the visit :* 10th September, 1984.
4. *Time spent in the college :* Three hours (11-00 a.m. to 2-00 p.m.).
5. *Discussion held with :* Sarvasbri John Almedia and Frank Miranda, members of the Fund Raising Committee and Fr. John Rumao, Mg. Trustee of the Trust who is the Ag. Principal of the proposed college. Committee also met some of the teachers of the college.
6. *Date of establishment of the college :* This is the first application of the society for affiliation of the college from 1984-85. The college started functioning from 16th July, 1984.
7. *Management of the college :* Our Lady of Grace, Trust, Papadi, Vasai, District Thane.
8. *Present status of affiliation :* Nil the application under consideration being the first for affiliation of the proposed college to the University.
9. *Nature of affiliation sought through the present application :* Affiliation is sought for teaching the courses of study for the First Year B.A. and the First Year B.Com. examinations.
10. *Need i.e. validity of justification for starting the college :* The Executive Council of the University had forwarded to the State Government, the application, under reference, for opening of the said college at papdi from 1984-85 and the Government by its letter No. NGC-3584/8144/UNI-2, dated 9th May, 1984, communicated to the University its approval for processing the same under Section 43(5) of the Bombay University Act, 1974. The need has thus been established. However, we have attached to our report an enclosure reproducing therein the statement in regard to the need for this college as made out by Father John Rumao, one of the Trustees of the said Trust.
11. *Fulfilment of application condition :* This is the application for affiliation of the proposed college. However, it may be stated that on receipt of the State Government's letter, referred to above and



upon its consideration by the Executive Council (Item No. 35 of 25/31 May, 1984), the college authorities were informed by the Registrar, as per the Council's decision, to start the college, pending local inquiries, by admitting students to one division of each of the First Year B.A. and B.Com. classes, on giving an undertaking that in addition to the fulfilment of the conditions mentioned in State Government's letter, they will also fulfil other conditions that may be laid down by the University authorities on the recommendation of a local inquiry committee. The conditions stipulated by the Government were that the college will not get any financial assistance for three years and that there must be an enrolment of at least 40 students in each of the classes out of whom at least 30 must appear for the respective examinations at the end of 1984-85. The college authorities gave the requisite undertaking. The condition in regard to the number of students has been fulfilled.

II. Land and Building

1. Land bearing Survey Nos. 3034-C, 3037-3038 and 3039 having a total area of two areas is in possession of the Trust and the same is earmarked for the Degree college building. We were furnished with a copy of the certificate No. MUN/TP/429, dated 28th June, 1984, given by the Vasai Municipal Council Administrator to the Trust of this college in which it has been mentioned that the Municipal Council has no objection if the land at site No. 63 (S. Nos. 2, 3, 103, 1057 pt. and Nala Land) in Village Mulgaon and Malonde, which is reserved in the Development Plan of the Council for 'College,' is acquired for the proposed college building. We were shown the site plan as also the plan of the proposed college building, both of which were sent to the University with the application.

Father Rumao, Principal designate, however, informed the University by his letter No. 48, dated 4th December, 1984, that the plan for the Degree College building submitted earlier might undergo a change as the management was trying to purchase a new site in close neighbourhood.

2. *Temporary accommodation pending construction of the permanent building* : Presently, college classes are being held in the premises of the Thomas Baptista Junior College which is owned and managed by the Trust. A resolution passed in this behalf is quoted below :—

"The management of Our Lady of Grace Trust has resolved in their meeting of Board of Trustees on 28th May, 1984, to run the College classes of F.T. B.A. and F.Y. B.Com. of St. Gonsalo Garcia College of Arts and Commerce in the premises of Thomas Baptists Junior College owned and managed by the said Trust pending construction of new Senior College Building."

Accommodation as described below is available in the said Junior college Building :—

Class Rooms (6) (each of 30' × 23'·6")

Library (19'7" × 50')

College Office (15' × 9'·6")

Staff Room (29' × 24')

Girls Room (22' × 18').

Besides a spacious hall and a big playground is also available. The Jr. and Sr. College classes are held in shifts. As regards the office



for the Principal, we have to state that for the time being he shares the office for the Principal of the Jr. College. At the time of our visit an additional floor on the Jr. College building was under construction to provide seven more classrooms from 1985-86. As regards adequacy of the presently available accommodation, we have to state that it is just sufficient for the present small size of the college. The entire campus is very compact and rather crowded. It is, therefore, very essential that the construction work of the permanent building for the college is undertaken and completed soon and the college is shifted to its own premises with adequate accommodation for class-rooms, tutorial rooms, library and reading room, common-rooms for boys and girls, office for the Principal and College, staff common-room, toilet facilities, Assembly Hall, small canteen, indoor games hall, etc. In course of time, the Principal has also to be provided with a suitable rent-free quarters either in the college building on the college campus or in the town. Attention of the representatives of the Trust has been invited by us to all the above requirements so that they can prepare the plan of the college building accordingly.

- (a) *Management of the college, constitution, Minority Status* : Our Lady of Grace Trust, Papdy, Vasai Dist. Thane, was registered under registration No. D-27 (Thane) (No. 927-D.T. 19-23 under the Bombay Public Trust's Act, 1950 (Bom-XXIX of 1950), in Greater Bombay Region, on 20th June, 1955.

Application for affiliation has been made by Shri John Remao, a Trustee of our Lady of Grace Trust. The registration certificate reference to above mentioned the name of the Trust as "Roman Catholic Church" of Our Lady Grace (word "Trust" appears to be an omission) On inquiries made in this regard as to the correct and proper name of the Trust which will manage and maintain this college and when asked to clarify the two different names of Trusts, we were informed that "Our Lady of Grace Trust", Papdi, known as "Roman Catholic Church of Our Lady of Grace Trust" registered under No. D-27 and that this trust namely "Roman Catholic Church of "Our Lady of Grace Trust" is for brevity's sake called as Our Lady of Grace Trust." In view of the registration certificate the management of the college will have to be mentioned in the University records as the Roman Catholic Church of Our Lady of Grace Trust Papdi and not as Our Lady of Grace Trust Papdi.

The aims and objects of the Trust produce for establishment of educational institutions. Our Lady of Grace Trust is at present running a primary school in English and Marathi Medium and a Jr. College, all at Papdi. The affairs of the Our Lady of Grace Trust are managed by a Board called "The Board of Trustees and this is the Governing Body of the college. The present members of the Board of Trustees are as follows :—

Minority Status : The trustees (i.e. Our Lady of Grace Trust) have claimed the minority status on the basis of religion—vide University letter No. Aff./Recog./4197 dated 15-4-1984.

3. *Financial Position* : The cost of the proposed college building to be met by obtaining donations for which a target of about Rs. 50 lakhs has been fixed. In our opinion the Trust would be able to maintain the college properly. An undertaking has been given to the effect that the Trust would meet the annual deficits of the college by way of outright grants to the college and not by way of advancing loans to the college.
4. *Staff Position* : The management in its meeting of the Board of Trustees held on 28-7-1984 has passed a resolution for appointing Rev. Fr. John Rumao Principal of the Our Lady of Grace Trust's Thomas Baptista Jr. College as the Acting Principal of the degree college till a suitable candidate was appointed to the post of Principal. He holds M.A. (II cl) and M.Ed. degrees. His appointment has been reported to the University for approval. We were informed that the post was advertised twice but no suitable candidate was available. The post has been advertised again. Appointment of a full-time lecturer for teaching Economics and Foundation Course Paper I had been made. Appointment of lecturers for other subjects are made on lecturers basis. Attention of the Principal designate has been invited to the holding of Tutorials in those subjects in which they are prescribed. The college authorities have also been advised to appoint the requisite non-teaching staff for the college.
5. *Library* : Accommodation presently provided for the college is inadequate. It can be approved only as a stop-gap arrangement. They were advised to incur an expenditure of Rs. 15,000/- on the purchase of books, text books, reference books and journals for the college library during 1984-85. The expenditure incurred during the year 1984-85 was of Rs. 9,923-94. They have also been advised to create and fill up the post of a librarian by the appointment of a duly qualified person in the prescribed scale of pay and to report his appointment to the University for approval. This library of the Jr. College is at present attending to the senior college library.
6. *College Furniture and Fittings* : These requirement are adequate for the present needs of the college.
7. *Students Amenities* : Attention of the college authorities have been drawn to the fact that facilities for Gymkhana, sports, canteen, a Health Centre, Common Rooms for boys and girls and an auditorium have to be provided. They have agreed to provide these facilities in their plan for the permanent building of the college. A good playground is available at present.
8. *Residential Quarters for the Principal* : The Principal will have to be provided, in course of time, suitable rent free quarters either in the college building or in the college campus or at a nearby place.



9. *Reserve Fund* : As per the requirement of the University the college authorities have been asked to create a Reserve Fund of Rs. 1 lakh for the college by depositing in fixed deposits annually an amount of Rs. 20,000/- as shown below and to deposit the amounts either with the Official Trustee or with or with the other Trustees nominated by the management for the purpose under an irrevocable trust deed :—

Rs. 20,000/- on or before 15-11-1984

Rs. 20,000/- on or before 15-11-1985

Rs. 20,000/- on or before 15-11-1986

Rs. 20,000/- on or before 15-11-1987

Rs. 20,000/- on or before 15-11-1988

The first two instalments have been deposited with the Catholic Co-operative Bank on 26th August, 1986. We were informed by the college authorities that this bank is an approved bank by the Reserve Bank of India.

10. *Local Managing Committee* : The Management has been informed that a local managing committee is required to be constituted as per provisions of Section 43 (3) (b) of the B.U. Act 1974 that there will have to be at least two meetings of this committee, one in each term, and that a proper record of these meetings is to be maintained.

- (3) (a) that they will appoint a qualified librarian in the prescribed scale of pay
(b) that they will incur an expenditure of Rs. 15,000/- on purchases of books and journals for the college library during 1984-85.
- (4) that they will create a reserve fund as advised in the report of this committee :
- (5) that they will appoint a local managing committee as required by section 43 (3) (b) of the Bombay University Act, 1974, and will hold at least two meetings of this committee, one in each academic term and will maintain a proper record of these meetings.

We further recommend that the college be permitted to have one division of the F.Y. B.A. class and also one division of the F.Y. B.Com. class. Any additional division should be opened with the prior approval of the University.
